2007 ELECTORAL DISTRIBUTION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA SUBMISSION TO THE ELECTORAL DISTRIBUTION COMMISSIONERS

This submission has been produced in response to the Electoral Distribution Commissioners' invitation regarding the distribution of state electoral boundaries in Western Australia. I am an independent writer with a specialist interest in Australian politics and elections; I am not a member of any political party and have no political interest to serve in the redistribution process. Although I am a resident of Victoria, I have some familiarity with Western Australia and its geography, and my hope is that some of my suggestions might be useful to the Commissioners: I believe that it is important for the functioning of democracy that citizens should contribute in matters where they have relevant expertise.

The submission is divided into five parts: some preliminary remarks explaining my general approach, looking particularly at the distinction between metropolitan and non-metropolitan districts (pages 1-3); a region-by-region description of how I would carry out the task of drawing new boundaries (pages 4-8); a table showing all of the proposed new districts and regions with their enrolment figures (pages 9-10); a detailed alphabetical listing of the proposed new districts, showing how each is constituted (pages 11-39); and a set of nine maps illustrating the proposed boundaries (pages 40-48).

GENERAL APPROACH

The 2005 amendments to the Western Australian *Electoral Act 1907* ("the Act") introduced, subject to a special allowance for large districts, the principle of "one vote one value" into elections for the Legislative Assembly. This therefore will be by far the most drastic redrawing of the state's electoral boundaries in recent times, since a number of new districts will need to be created in previously under-represented areas, while several non-metropolitan districts face abolition.

The matters to be considered in drawing boundaries are set out in section 16I of the Act, and I have little to add to them. This year's distribution will involve greater departures from the existing boundaries than would normally be the case, but it should still be possible to respect them in a large number of cases, particularly when they follow obvious physical features that divide communities and pose barriers to transport. There are also instances where existing boundaries could be improved by reuniting suburbs or municipalities that have been split by previous boundaries.

The primary task of the Commissioners is to produce boundaries that provide equitable representation for everyone in the state, and this can best be done by As I believe the following descriptions show, it is possible to provide for districts that are not just within the prescribed 10% tolerance but well within, and without sacrificing

community of interest or other aspects of geographical coherence. Although the Act provides for a 20% band of variation for elector numbers (30% in very large districts), all but three of the 59 proposed districts in this submission are within a band of 10%.

Nor is there any need for the Commissioners to be overly concerned with future population movements; since the Act now provides for boundaries to be redrawn before every election, long-term stability of the boundaries is less of a consideration. Districts in high growth areas should in general have slightly fewer electors than those in low growth areas, but predicting future growth is an inexact science at best, and fair representation in the present should not be sacrificed to hypothetical fairness in the future, given that the Commissioners will have the opportunity to correct any problems in four years time.

The Act requires that the new districts be divided into three metropolitan regions and three non-metropolitan, so a useful place to start is by considering the boundary between metropolitan and non-metropolitan districts. According to the 26 February enrolment figures, the existing 34 metropolitan districts have a total of 935,539 electors between them, while the 23 non-metropolitan districts have a total of 324,126. Dividing by the quota of 21,350 gives a total of 43.82 quotas for the metropolitan area and 15.18 quotas for the non-metropolitan area.

However, this calculation makes no allowance for the notional electors to be added for very large electorates. The four existing electorates that exceed 100,000 square km (Central Kimberley-Pilbara, Kimberley, Murchison-Eyre and North West Coastal) cover a total area of approximately 2,223,000 square km, equivalent to 33,345 notional electors or 1.56 quotas. This figure is likely to rise slightly with the new boundaries, since districts that are currently close to the 100,000 square km threshold, particularly Merredin and Roe, will need to gain extra territory to reach the quota.

The presence of the notional electors means that the average enrolment per district will be more than the quota of 21,350. Working with a total of 1.6 quotas for the notional electors, the average per district rises to 21,929, or 102.7% of a quota (60.6 divided by 59). On this revised figure, the metropolitan area has enough electors for 42.66 districts, and the non-metropolitan area – including the notional electors – 16.34 districts.

In light of these considerations, there are three possible strategies for dividing the state between metropolitan and non-metropolitan:

- (a) Adhere to the existing boundary, accepting that metropolitan districts will have a significantly different average enrolment from non-metropolitan ones;
- (b) Adjust the boundary to transfer some 5,000-10,000 electors from the non-metropolitan area to the metropolitan, allowing the creation of 43 metropolitan districts and 16 non-metropolitan; or
- (c) Adjust the boundary to transfer a larger number of electors, some 12,000-17,000, from metropolitan to non-metropolitan, allowing for 42 metropolitan districts and 17 non-metropolitan.

Option (a) seems to have little to recommend it apart from its simplicity. If parliament wished the Commissioners to adhere strictly to the metropolitan area as currently defined it would have been an easy matter for it to say so; instead, section 16H(1)(a)(ii) of the Act only requires that the metropolitan regions be "generally coextensive" with that area. I submit that that expression is intended to permit just such minor transfers of area (and therefore electors) to equalise representation as would occur under options (b) or (c).

Of those two, option (b) may be thought preferable since the number of electors to be transferred is smaller. However, there are a number of considerations which in my view tell in favor of option (c):

- * Transferring electors into the non-metropolitan region will increase, albeit slightly, the equality of representation in the Legislative Council, since non-metropolitan regions have significantly fewer electors than metropolitan ones.
- * Providing for 42 metropolitan districts allows for the creation of three equal metropolitan regions, of 14 districts each; with 43, one region would have 15 districts and therefore diluted representation in the upper house. Non-metropolitan regions, on the other hand, would be unequal under either option (5-6-6 or 5-5-6).
- * Although some of their electors will have come from the metropolitan region, providing for 17 non-metropolitan districts will still give a greater voice to country people than if there were only 16. It is perhaps relevant to note that the Commissioners in their media briefing of 3 April suggested a 42-17 split.
- * The population distribution on the fringes of the metropolitan area is such as to make it generally easier to find areas within the existing metropolitan boundary that are reasonably rural in character but still have significant numbers of electors, than the reverse. I suggest making the transfer in four small parcels, of 3,000-6,000 electors each: in the Cities of Wanneroo, Swan and Rockingham and the Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale (the total number transferred is 16,272). Such small adjustments result in a boundary for the metropolitan region that is clearly still "generally coextensive" with the existing boundary.

I have therefore followed option (c) and made appropriate adjustments to the regional boundaries in the descriptions that follow.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED BOUNDARIES

Northern Metropolitan

The existing Northern Metropolitan region contains 14 districts, with a total enrolment of 390,586 or 18.29 quotas. Even allowing for the transfer of the Two Rocks-Yanchep area to a non-metropolitan region, there will obviously need to be four new districts created.

I propose the creation of *Innaloo*, from the northern part of the existing *Churchlands* plus the southern end of *Carine*; *Nollamara*, consisting mostly of the northern parts of *Yokine* with smaller contributions from four neighboring districts; *Craigie*, consisting mostly of the south-western part of *Joondalup* but also including territory from *Hillarys* and *Mindarie*; and *Gnangara*, which takes roughly equal shares from the existing *Girrawheen*, *Kingsley* and *Wanneroo*. Note that the first two of these re-create districts that existed prior to the 2003 distribution.

These creations allow the existing 14 districts to retain their current names and general configuration, although all of them of course must lose some electors. Working from the southern end of the region, *Cottesloe*, *Nedlands* and *Perth* all contract within their existing boundaries; *Churchlands* shifts to the south, taking almost all of the Town of Cambridge; *Yokine* and *Maylands* also shift south, but remain clearly recognisable.

Further north, Balcatta and Carine retain most of their existing boundaries; Girrawheen shifts slightly eastward, taking some electors from the Eastern Metropolitan region; Hillarys loses just one suburb (Padbury) to the new Craigie; and Kingsley retains its north-south orientation within slightly more regular boundaries. The far northern districts of Joondalup, Mindarie and Wanneroo undergo more significant change, but remain clearly centred on their respective core areas.

Of the resulting 18 districts, four must be moved into another region to ensure equality among the metropolitan regions. Since the Act clearly intends retaining the Swan River as a regional boundary, the obvious move is to shift the easternmost four districts – Girrawheen, Maylands, Nollamara and Yokine – into the Eastern Metropolitan region.

Eastern Metropolitan

The Eastern Metropolitan region currently contains ten districts with 275,810 electors, a total of 12.92 quotas. However, with the loss of two parcels of electors – at the northern end of Swan Hills and the southern end of Serpentine-Jarrahdale – to non-metropolitan regions, plus the 4,826 electors transferred to Girrawheen (mentioned above), there will be enough electors in the region for only a little over twelve districts.

Correction of an anomaly in the southern part of the region reduces this total further: the existing *Serpentine-Jarrahdale* extends across the City of Cockburn and into the City of Rockingham and Town of Kwinana, thus straddling two quite separate growth corridors. Transferring this territory into the Southern Metropolitan region brings the

region's entitlement back below twelve quotas, so one of the two new districts will need to draw on electors from a neighboring region.

I therefore propose the creation of *Cannington*, a compact district along the Canning River on the current boundary between the Eastern and Southern Metropolitan regions; and *Mundaring*, a district formed almost entirely from the shire of that name, with parts of the existing *Midland* and *Swan Hills*, at the eastern edge of the metropolitan area.

Most of the existing districts in the region can then be retained in roughly their current positions: Ballajura, Bassendean and Belmont undergo only minor change; Swan Hills moves inward to become a more identifiably urban district; Midland and Darling Range both shift southward as a result of the creation of Mundaring.

At the southern end of the region, however, it is impossible and indeed undesirable to retain the current configuration; the existing Serpentine-Jarrahdale stretches in a "U" shape from Canning Vale right around to Kelmscott. I propose that Armadale move outwards to the west and south, leaving room for two districts that can be reasonably identified with the existing Southern River and Kenwick, although in neither case is the old name appropriate; I have called them Thornlie and Gosnells respectively. The final district would then include the northern parts of Armadale plus the semi-rural areas to its east; it is effectively the replacement for Serpentine-Jarrahdale, although it includes relatively little of its territory. Since it has some affinity with the old district of Roleystone I have used that name instead.

Southern Metropolitan

The ten districts of the existing Southern Metropolitan region have a total of 269,143 electors or 12.61 quotas. The loss of electors in the far south to the non-metropolitan area is more than compensated by the gain from *Serpentine-Jarrahdale* referred to above, so there will be room for about twelve and a half districts.

The half is the proposed *Carrington*, already discussed; the other two new districts are *Melville*, formed from the northern parts of *Murdoch* and the south-eastern part of *Alfred Cove*, and *Kwinana*, formed mostly from the municipality of that name but also including some coastal parts of the City of Cockburn and the suburb of Baldivis from *Peel*.

The ten existing districts in the region can then remain substantially in place, and in most cases their geographical coherence is improved. *Fremantle* loses its share of the City of Melville; *Willagee* loses its northern and south-eastern extremities; *Riverton* contracts almost entirely to the City of Canning; *Cockburn* and *South Perth* lose everything outside their respective namesake municipalities; and *Murdoch* and *Victoria Park* acquire more regular southern boundaries, along the railway and the Leach Highway.

Alfred Cove acquires a less regular shape, but it remains entirely within the City of Melville and has strong community of interest linking the waterfront suburbs. In the far south, Peel and Rockingham split the urban Rockingham area between them, with the border between them following suburb boundaries.

To make up a new region of 14 districts, the Southern Metropolitan region has to gain two districts from Eastern Metropolitan; the logical candidates would seem to be *Cannington* and *Thornlie*.

South West

The existing South West region contains eleven districts with a total enrolment of 165,808, or 7.7 quotas. With the gains from metropolitan regions obtained by shifting the boundary inwards south of Rockingham and in the Serpentine-Mundijong-Jarrahdale area, there should be sufficient electors for eight districts.

The three districts proposed for abolition are *Collie-Wellington*, *Leschenault* and *Warren-Blackwood*. None of them has a strong geographic focus of its own, and in each case the electors can be conveniently absorbed by neighboring districts. The district of *Dawesville* also disappears, but *Singleton* is a direct replacement for it.

The City of Mandurah plus the southern end of the City of Rockingham together have just enough electors for two districts, but the southern one would include central Mandurah and therefore take the name *Mandurah*, while the northern one I have called *Singleton*. The loss of its share of the City of Mandurah leaves *Murray* as a basically inland district, taking most of the existing *Collie-Wellington*.

Bunbury then absorbs the whole of the existing Leschenault, shedding some electors in the city's southern suburbs so as to stay within the prescribed range. Vasse retains its existing territory based on Busselton and also extends south to Margaret River and Augusta, leaving Capel as a slightly more rural district, stretching from the suburbs of Bunbury to the coast south of Pemberton. (This unfortunately involves keeping the Shire of Manjimup divided, but the neighboring Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes can be reunited in a single district.)

At the eastern end of the region, *Albany* expands to take the whole of the City of Albany, which leaves just enough electors in the region to constitute the district of *Stirling* at close to quota. However, the inclusion of the Shire of Collie would give it an odd shape, with a long north-western tail, so I suggest instead transferring that shire to *Avon* and giving *Stirling* the southern end of the existing *Wagin* (which is proposed for abolition, as explained below).

These changes give *Stirling* a more "agricultural" character, but that is not a problem since the South West region needs to shed two districts in order to preserve approximate equality among the non-metropolitan regions, and *Albany* and *Stirling* are the only possible contenders. That leaves the region as a shorter and narrower coastal strip, but one that clearly still meets the description of "a region that includes coastal and forest areas in the south-west of the State" (section 16H(1)(d)).

Agricultural

The Agricultural region currently contains seven districts with an aggregate enrolment of 93,886, or 4.4 quotas. None of the existing districts are large enough to invoke the large

district allowance, but two of them, *Merredin* and *Roe*, are quite close to doing so, at approximately 73,550 and 87,975 square km respectively. Since both will need to gain electors, this therefore becomes a consideration, but the territory currently in the region would not make a huge difference: even if the whole region were covered by the large district allowance, it would only be worth a little over 3,900 notional electors, or about 0.18 of a quota.

Clearly Agricultural will still be short of the required numbers for five districts. This is to be expected, since it and Mining & Pastoral will only have nine districts between them (or 11, counting *Albany* and *Stirling*), and with notional electors taken into account the Mining & Pastoral region has well over four quotas. So one district will need to straddle the existing boundary between the two regions; I propose *Merredin* for that role.

Extending *Merredin* to the north-east, giving it a large area of sparsely-populated territory from the existing *Murchison-Eyre*, allows the other six districts in the region to be quite neatly reduced to four. *Greenough* and *Wagin* would be abolished; *Geraldton* would acquire the most urbanised parts of *Greenough*; *Roe* would retain its existing territory and gain most of its extra electors from *Wagin* (plus a small number of notional electors, since it would then exceed 100,000 square km); and *Avon* and *Moore* would both remain in roughly their existing positions, absorbing additional electors from a variety of sources on their peripheries (including, in the case of *Moore*, some previously metropolitan electors in the Cities of Wanneroo and Swan).

With the loss of *Merredin* and the gain of *Albany* and *Stirling*, Agricultural would contain six districts and would evidently meet the criterion of an area "in which the land use is primarily for agricultural purposes" (section 16H(1)(c)).

Mining & Pastoral

The Mining & Pastoral region currently contains five districts and 64,432 electors, or 3.02 quotas, but the notional electors added by the large district allowance bring that total to 97,777, or 4.58 quotas. Adding in most of the existing district of *Merredin*, as discussed above, allows the region to retain five districts. One is effectively a merger between *Merredin* and *Murchison-Eyre*, which I suggest should retain the name *Merredin*, while the other four are readily identifiable with existing districts.

Working from the north: Kimberley can now expand to include the whole Kimberley area; Central Kimberley-Pilbara can take most of the Pilbara, including the whole Shire of East Pilbara (since it would no longer include any of the Kimberleys, I suggest it revert to the name Burrup); North West Coastal loses the Shire of Roebourne but reunites the Shire of Ashburton and also takes a large inland area from Murchison-Eyre (its name also seems less appropriate, so I suggest reverting to Ningaloo); Merredin retains most of its existing territory but also takes in the remote heartland of Murchison-Eyre; and Kalgoorlie remains centred on the city of that name, but expands into the neighboring municipalities to bring it up to the new quota.

All five districts would partake, in roughly comparable degrees, of the notional electors made available by the large district allowance, so none of their electors would be

disproportionately advantaged. While it would be possible to confine most of the notional electors to just four or even three districts, those districts would then have very few real electors, and electors in other districts would have correspondingly less representation. Since the clear intention of the Act is to provide for fair representation of all electors, it seems desirable that the "bonus" representation given to remote areas should, other things being equal, be shared out as widely as possible.

The Commissioners might wish to consider transferring *Roe* from the Agricultural to the Mining & Pastoral region; this would have the advantage of making the two regions much more equal in terms of actual electors, and would therefore give them fairer representation in the new Legislative Council. However, I confess I am unable to convince myself that *Roe* can fairly be described as part of an area "in which the land use is primarily for mining and pastoral purposes" (section 16H(1)(b)).
