LIMITING IMBALANCE IN REPRESENTATION TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

In 1987 and 2005 the State Parliament passed two significant electoral reform Acts. The core purpose of each of these reforms was reduction of imbalance in representation by bringing our electoral system closer to the democratic principle of one person, one vote, one value. The 2005 legislation informed the 2007 redistribution and tolerated a level of imbalance in representation to the Legislative Council by prescribing 6 MLCs to each region.

Table A deals with representation of electors in the Legislative Council and compares the ratio which existed at the time of the redistribution in 2007 with the ratio which exists in the enrolments being used for the current redistribution.

Since the first redistribution under the revised legislation took place in 2007, imbalance has increased overall and to a greater degree between the extreme example shown in Table B.
