It was with great interest that I read submissions to the 2023 Electoral Boundary Review, available on the WAEC website. I appreciate the opportunity to comment, given that I have serious concerns at the proposal, contained in the WA Labor Submission, to abolish the seat of North West Central, reducing, by one, the sixteen seats currently representing regional WA.

Regional WA is a significant contributor to our State's economy. According to the April 2023 Western Australian Economic Profile mining contributed \$186.8 billion (\$46 percent) to the Gross State Product, add to this \$10.8 billion 3 per cent) from agriculture, forestry and fishing and it is clear that regional WA creates wealth that benefits our whole state. At the same time regional areas experience significant disadvantage. The WA Country Health Service records that people in rural areas have a life expectancy approximately two years lower than their city counterparts; while remote and very remote communities have a mortality rate 30 percent higher than that of metropolitan residents. Reducing the number of regional parliamentary seats will deprive already disadvantaged people of representation.

Reducing the number of regional seats will increase pressure on the remaining rural parliamentarians, who already face the challenge of representing areas the size of some countries; North West Central is larger than New South Wales; Central Wheatbelt approximately the size of Portugal. If North West Central were abolished, its component parts added to adjoining electorates this problem would be exacerbated.

l also caution against disregarding the Perth Metropolitan Boundary when preparing electorate margins; such a step would see rural residents swamped by metropolitan voters, their specific needs marginalized.
